## TITLE IX COORDINATOR

Title IX is a federal law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in any federally funded education program or activity. Title IX protects all members of MTSA's community who experience sex discrimination, sexual harassment, sexual assault, interpersonal violence (including dating and domestic violence), stalking, or discrimination on the basis of pregnancy. These protections apply to students, faculty, staff, contractors, applicants and campus visitors. We are committed to creating and fostering a living, learning, and working environment free from all forms of sex discrimination. MTSA's Title IX Coordinator manages Title IX compliance, responds to, and manages complaints of discrimination and harassment. Title IX Individuals do not need to file a Formal Complaint to receive Supportive Measures and/or Accommodations.
